Sant Cugat is landscape: flora, woodland, trees, plants, flowers, fountains... Practically half the municipality lies within the Collserola Nature Park, one of the largest nature parks in the metropolitan area.

The Xandri Pine Tree, more than 250 years of history stretching up to the sky.

The Sant Medir hermitage: an excellent bike outing, with open spaces where you can get your breath back.

The city has an average of one tree per person.

Sustainable mobility, with the El Vallès train, which has become one of the city's key thoroughfares.

Active tourism and open-air sport: horse riding, golf at the oldest club in Catalonia, cycling, running...
