#### **Itinerary description:**

The itinerary starts at the head of the Rambla de Can Bell, which we can access via the Carretera de la Rabassada road. We'll take the path that leads to the farmhouse of Can Bell, which we will pass on our right. We'll continue straight until we reach the Roure Gros, an exceptionally large oak. We'll follow the trail that crosses the brook of Can Bell and leads to the Serrat d'en Bell ridge. Once we reach the top of the ridge, we'll follow the path to our right. We'll pass another path on our left, and we'll head straight on as we enter the valley of Can Gordi. The path reaches the head of the valley and veers north along the opposite side, crossing the brook of Can Gordi once again. We'll follow it until we reach a sign pointing the way to a spring called the Font de Sant Vicenç del Bosc. After visiting the spring, we'll visit the ruins of the church of Sant Vicenç del Bosc before returning to the main path. We'll follow it until we reach the Rambla de Can Bell, where we'll take a left and return to our starting point.

#### **Points of interest:**

#### Can Bell:

A two-storey farmhouse with a gable roof. It displays a voussoired door, a richly decorated window in the flamboyant Gothic style (16th century) and an inscription with the name of the house.

#### Can Gordi:

A farmhouse documented as far back as the 16th century. Its last farmers left in the late 1940s; it was left abandoned, and now lies in ruins.

### Font de Sant Vicenç del Bosc:

This spring is documented as far back as the 10<sup>th</sup> century. The front is made of stone and crowned with a semicircular arch. The spring, however, has run dry.

## Church of Sant Vicenç del Bosc:

Documented as far back as the 10<sup>th</sup> century, this church was used as a rural parish in the Middle Ages. Today, it lies in ruins.
