

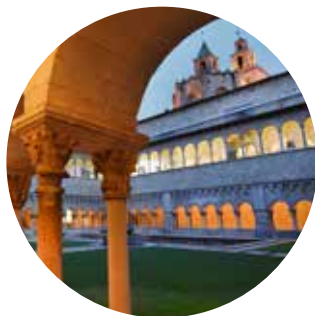
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The 10 essentials of Sant Cugat



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Monastery of Sant Cugat

A fundamental exponent of medieval art in Catalonia, this monastery was founded in the ninth century. With 144 sculpted capitals, it houses one of the most exceptional Romanesque cloisters in Europe.



City Museums

Three public museums on different themes. Learn about architecture and monastic life at the Monastery, see the *Modernista* Winery or visit the Grau Garriga Centre for Textile Art.



Torre Negra

A fortified house from the year 1145 for the defense of the territorial domain of the Monastery of Sant Cugat.



Collserola Nature Park

One of the largest nature parks in the metropolitan area, with over 8,000 hectares of preserved natural space. Perfect for discovering new trails and getting some exercise.



13 urban parks
